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About the hospital

East Tallinn Central Hospital is one of the largest hospitals in Tallinn, consisting of [seven clinics](#): the Diagnostic Clinic, the Clinic of Internal Medicine, the Eye Clinic, the Women's Clinic, the Surgery Clinic, the Clinic of Medical Rehabilitation and the Long-term Nursing Clinic.

We receive patients at outpatient clinics in Ravi, Magdaleena, Tõnismäe and Järve[units](#).

Medical activities are supported by hospital [services](#). Our hospital employs more than **2,500 people**, including over **400 doctors** and more than **1,000 nurses**.

- 579 beds
- Of these, 521 inpatient beds, including 336 active treatment and as well as 58 outpatient beds.

- Received 513,860 patients, including 356 516 visits to specialist doctors and 157 344 visits to nurses and midwives.
- Performed 13 692 inpatient surgeries and 13 073 day outpatient surgeries.

From 2021, we have full membership status in the [Organisation of European Cancer Institutes \(OECI\)](#). This network includes more than 100 cancer centres and institutes all over Europe, from EU as well as other countries. In addition, our Eye Clinic has been the Baltic Centre of Ocular Oncology since 1993, covering the treatment of intraocular and orbital tumours in patients from Latvia, Lithuania and Estonia.

The hospital's Centre of Spinal Surgery is an internationally accredited [AO Spine Centre](#).

Since summer 2016, East Tallinn Central Hospital Women's Clinic has held valid accreditation by the [European Board and College of Obstetrics and Gynaecology](#), acknowledging our Women's Clinic as an accredited training centre in obstetrics and gynaecology in Europe. Our hospital has been awarded the title of baby-friendly hospital. We were the first to be granted this title by [UNICEF](#) in 2008 and again in 2019 after repeat evaluation.



In 2011, [the European Board of Ophthalmology](#) granted our Eye Clinic accreditation as an international eye clinic. Since 2016, East Tallinn Central Hospital Eye Clinic has also been part of the [ERN-EYE \(European Reference Network\)](#).
